
Strolling through Wickford's historic streets—lined with charming shops, waterfront cafés, and harbor views—adds its own magic to the experience.



#### More about Holly:

Holly's travels across four continents inform her art, which often features birds as expressive symbols of emotion and intelligence. Based in the Northeast US, her work is exhibited in galleries, shows, and publications such as the Boston Globe and Where Women Create, and is included in collections like MOCA Jacksonville and the Langham Hotel Boston.

A highlight of her career is a collaboration with Google, creating a large-scale oil painting for their Quantum lab in California—fusing art and science to offer moments of reflection in a techdriven world.

Many of you may remember the beautiful festival programs that use to be printed. Due to our efforts to reduce our paper footprint we starting printing only festival maps. One of the fun parts about the booklet was selecting a piece of fine art to be the cover and main design inspiration for that year's event. 



Start by exploring **End of Main & Gardner's Wharf t**o see RI's infamous quohoging boats and other fishing vessels plus views of boats coming in and out of the harbor. On your way back up Main Street stroll down **Bay, Washington & Gold Street** for more historic homes and secret gardens.
